More than 50 underprivileged children took part in a 'Gift of Giving' iftar event, volunteered and sponsored by Dial-A-Battery and organised by Action Care, the UAE-based educational development organisation.

This year's theme introduces children to 'Cultures Around the World' through drama, music, and interactive activities with elements such as giving and 'sameness' between people from around the world weaved into the story.

The event was held in the Movenpick hotel in Oud Metha, and involved active games including an obstacle course and piñatas, followed by an activity session engaging the children in creating a collage of countries from around the world. The children were given a gift of a school backpack containing a lunchbox, water bottle and stationary kits following the iftar.
